School Improvement - Handwriting Blitz

At St. Joseph's we believe handwriting to be an essential skill for life. Every child is entitled to receive skillful teaching and our handwriting scheme enables pupils to develop a fluent and legible handwriting style. In order to raise the profile of handwriting within school, we have implemented a three week handwriting blitz. This means pupils are taught handwriting everyday by a member of staff which is reinforced by a homework sheet that must be completed in the evening and returned the following morning. By the end of the blitz we expect to see a vast improvement in handwriting across the school. 
