

## Pupil Premium 2013 – 2014

### Pupil Premium Grant

St Joseph's Catholic Primary School has 209 pupils on roll and receives a Pupil Premium Grant as part of the School Budget.

The Pupil Premium Grant is a Government initiative to address the educational inequalities between children from low-income families and those from higher income families. The Pupil Premium is now £1300 per eligible pupil for free school meals [FSM] and includes all pupils who have been eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years.

If you think you are eligible for free school meals [FSM] please ask at the office for more information. All information about free school meals [FSM] is confidential and if you receive the grant, the school is then able to access extra funding to support St Joseph's pupils in a number of ways.
